# A WARM WELCOME IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF ST ANDREWS AND EDINBURGH IN SCOTLAND

The Catholic Grandparents Association received a warm welcome from the Archdiocese of St Andrews and Edinburgh where the first steps have been taken to introduce the CGA to the Archdiocese.



In a Zoom event which took place earlier this month, Archbishop Leo Cushley,

Archbishop of St Andrews and Edinburgh, and Catherine Wiley, Founder of the CGA, spoke about their commitment to a ministry for grandparents.

During the Zoom meeting, which was attended by pastoral workers, priests, deacons and grandparents, it was noted that grandparents form probably the largest and most active contingent serving the life of our parishes. They are our sacristans, readers, extraordinary ministers, catechists and more. Serving parishes like this is fulfilling, but what is often closest to the hearts of grandparents in the Church today is what they can do to keep their families connected to the Church and Catholic faith.

In her keynote address Catherine gave great encouragement to the grandparents present. She also presented a vision of how the CGA ministry could work in the archdiocese so as we parishes and grandparents can connect, support each other, share ideas and experience and build their sense of mission in today's Church.

The CGA is very grateful to the Very Reverend Jeremy Milne, Vicar Episcopal for Marriage & Families within the Archdiocese of St Andrews & Edinburgh, for the opportunity to share ideas on how we can support all grandparents in their own faith and in their important place in all our parishes and families.
