REFLECTIONS FROM THE GRANDPARENTS' FAITH CAFÉ

The Grandparents' Faith Café met virtually *via* Zoom on Tuesday 9 March to reflect on the theme of 'Grandparents as Faith Heroes'. Lorene Hanley Duquin, author of 15 books including *The Catholic Grandparents Handbook*, was the guest speaker and she offered much food for thought to those who joined in the Faith Café from Ireland, UK, USA and Australia.

In her address Lorene gave a wonderful overview of why she believes that all Grandparents are faith heroes, saying, "Of course, Grandparents are faith heroes because we are the ones who pass on our Catholic faith to our children and grandchildren. God has given us gifts for a purpose. One important thing we can do is help our grandchildren, our adult children, and other grandparents to identify their gifts. Talking about God-given gifts is one of the simplest ways to share faith. We can recognise that someone else's gifts offset our weaknesses. Understanding this helps us to build a stronger sense of community in our families, in our community, and in the Catholic Grandparents Association."

Lorene went on to say, "The five things that I believe make every one of us a Faith Hero are:

- 1. We were called and we said yes!
- 2. The Holy Spirit continues to call us and we just need to listen!
- 3. We use our God-given gifts to give meaning and purpose to our lives!
- 4. We sometimes struggle but we are sustained by our faith.
- 5. We are people of prayer who allow God's love to flow through us to other people."

Reflections at the Faith Café were delivered beautifully by Noreen Burns from Ireland and by John and Geraldine Dayball from Australia.

Pope Francis has published the message by Pope Francis for Vocations Sunday 2021 which this years falls on Sunday 21 April. The theme chosen by Pope Francis is 'St Joseph: The Dream of Vocation'. The Holy Father says, "God looks on the heart (cf. 1 Sam 16:7), and in Saint Joseph he recognised the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines. Vocations have this same goal: to beget and renew lives every day." We know that Grandparents play an important role in the nurturing of vocations too. HOLY WEEK RESOURCES FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY AND A NEW CHILDREN'S PAGE



A TWEET AND A PRAYER FROM POPE FRANCIS AS HE LAUNCHED THE AMORIS LAETITIA FAMILY YEAR

In a tweet on Friday 19 March, as he prepared to launch the Amoris Laetitia Family Year, Pope Francis shared this prayer and this beautiful intention for families: "I pray that every family may feel the living presence of the Holy Family of Nazareth in their own home, that they may fill our small domestic communities with sincere and generous



love, a source of joy even in trials and difficulties. #AmorisLaetitia".

KNOCK SHRINE DESIGNATED AS BOTH MARIAN AND EUCHARISTIC

Our Patron Archbishop Neary, Archbishop of Tuam, has welcomed the Holy Father's formal recognition of the Shrine at Knock as an International Marian and Eucharistic Shrine. The Shrine at Knock is the home of our National Grandparents Pilgrimage in Ireland. Since that August evening in 1879 pilgrims have been coming to Knock, recognising their dependence on God and the way in which God's mother reaches out and cares for them. In the last fifty years this Shrine



has been honoured by the visit of Pope John Paul II in 1979, Saint Teresa of Calcutta in 1993 and in 2018, Pope Francis.

His Holiness formally designated Knock as an International Marian and Eucharistic Shrine on the Feast of Saint Joseph, Friday 19 March, in a message which was transmitted via video link at the Mass in the Shrine Chapel.
