The Grandparents' Faith Café met virtually *via* Zoom on Tuesday 8 June to reflect on the theme 'The Amazing Grace of Grandparents in the Family'. Peggy Stanton, the host of 'A Place of Peace' on Ave Maria Radio, was the guest speaker.

In her address, Peggy highlighted the many graces there are in being a Grandparent like getting a second chance at relationships, the wisdom gained from being a parent that can be applied to grandchildren, and the humility that comes with wisdom.

Peggy said that as Grandparents, "We have learned to love rather than seeking to be loved and that we have also learned to listen." She also offered some advice for Grandparents in relating to their grandchildren and invited them to be present and to just show up for them. She also said that Prayer is the key and that when our grandchildren see us praying, taking that precious time to be present with God, we are teaching them and catechising them by our witness.



Reflections at the Faith Café were delivered by Mary Cotter from Dublin who spoke about how the CGA offered her comfort and hope during the many lockdowns as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. Faith Café moderator Brenda Drumm also shared a reflection about her Grandmother Mary Drumm and shared some of the many old Irish sayings that Mary used to share with her Grandchildren like 'a new broom sweeps clean but the old brush knows the corners'.

Cardinal Tagle, the Prefect of the Congregation for the Evangelisation of Peoples said that his visits to refugee camps in Greece, Lebanon, Jordan and Bangladesh, reminded him of his migrant roots. He said, "In them I saw my grandfather who was born in China, but was forced to leave his homeland as a young boy in search of a better future in the Philippines."
