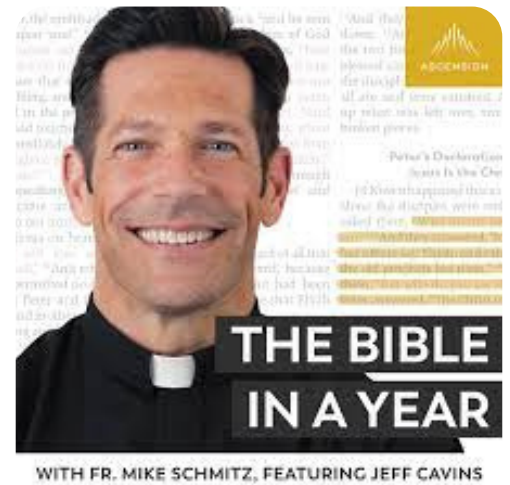


## BIBLE IN A YEAR PODCAST

## POPE FRANCIS PENS A LETTER TO MARRIED COUPLES

Pope Francis took the opportunity of the Feast of the Holy Family on 26 December to release a letter to married couples as part of the Amoris Laetitia Family Year. In the letter he said, "Marriage, as a vocation, calls you to steer a tiny boat – wave-tossed yet sturdy, thanks to the reality of the sacrament – across a sometimes stormy sea." The Holy Father had a special word for Grandparents in the letter, saying, "Families greatly need grandparents, for they are humanity's living memory, a memory that "can help to build a more humane and welcoming world".
